

Households and Families

In 2009-2013 there were 1,000 households in Kalama, Washington. The average household size was 2.6 people.

Families made up 61 percent of the households in Kalama, Washington. This figure includes both married-couple families (44 percent) and other families (18 percent). Of other families, 9 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 39 percent of all households in Kalama, Washington. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Kalama, Washington, 41 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 28 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.



Among persons 15 and older, 51 percent of males and 45 percent of females are currently married.


In Kalama, Washington, 58 grandparents lived with their grandchildren under 18 years old. Of those grandparents, 26 percent of them had financial responsibility for their grandchildren.

Nativity and Foreign Born

An estimated 97 percent of the people living in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013 were native residents of the United States and 50 percent of these residents were living in the state in which they were born.

An estimated 3 percent of the people living in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013 were foreign born. Of the foreign born population, 32 percent were naturalized U.S. citizens, and 100 percent entered the country before the year 2010. An estimated less than 0.5 percent of the foreign born entered the country in 2010 or later.


Foreign born residents of Kalama, Washington come from different parts of the world. Region of Birth for the Foreign Born Population in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013



Language


Among people at least five years old living in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013, 5 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 47 percent spoke Spanish and 53 percent spoke some other language; 51 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."


Percent of the Population 5 years and over who Speak a Language other than English in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013



Geographic Mobility

In 2009-2013, 78 percent of the people at least one year old living in Kalama, Washington were living in the same residence one year earlier.






Education

In 2009-2013, 95 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 15 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. An estimated 5 percent did not complete high school.

The total school enrollment in Kalama, Washington was 592 in 2009-2013. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 113 and elementary or high school enrollment was 381 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 98.



Disability

In Kalama, Washington, among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in 2009-2013, 15 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 11 percent of people under 18 years old, to 14 percent of people 18 to 64 years old, and to 29 percent of those 65 and over.

Employment Status and Type of Employer

In Kalama, Washington, 54 percent of the population 16 and over were employed; 35 percent were not currently in the labor force.


An estimated 77 percent of the people employed were private wage and salary workers; 14 percent were federal, state, or local government workers; and 9 percent were self-employed in their own (not incorporated) business.

Percent by Industry in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013







Commuting to Work

An estimated 83 percent of Kalama, Washington workers drove to work alone in 2009-2013, and 5 percent carpooled. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 23 minutes to get to work.


Percent of Workers 16 and over Commuting by Mode in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013



Income


The median income of households in Kalama, Washington was \$46,386. An estimated 9 percent of households had income below \$15,000 a year and 4 percent had income over \$150,000 or more.

Median Earnings for Full-Time Year-Round Workers by Sex in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013




An estimated 79 percent of the households received earnings and 24 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. An estimated 29 percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$17,887. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

Poverty and Participation in Government Programs

In 2009-2013, 11 percent of people were in poverty. An estimated 12 percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 2 percent of people 65 years old and over. An estimated 10 percent of all families and 29 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.




Health Insurance

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013, 85 percent had health insurance coverage and 15 percent did not have health insurance coverage. For those under 18 years of age, 12 percent had no health insurance coverage. The civilian noninstitutionalized population had both private and public health insurance, with 67 percent having private coverage and 34 percent having public coverage.

Population

In 2009-2013, Kalama, Washington has a total population of 2,600 -- 1,400 (52 percent) females and 1,300 (48 percent) males. The median age was 33.1 years. An estimated 29 percent of the population was under 18 years and 14 percent was 65 years and older.


Age Distribution of People in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013



For people reporting one race alone, 95 percent were White; less than 0.5 percent were Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 2 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 2 percent were some other race. An estimated 5 percent reported two or more races. An estimated 4 percent of the people in Kalama, Washington were Hispanic. An estimated 89 percent of the people in Kalama, Washington were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Housing Characteristics

In 2009-2013, Kalama, Washington had a total of 1,100 housing units, 10 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 70 percent were in single-unit structures, 15 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 15 percent were mobile homes. An estimated 44 percent of the housing units were built since 1990.



Types of Housing Units in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013


The median number of rooms in all housing units in Kalama, Washington is 6. Of these housing units, 68 percent have three or more bedrooms.

Occupied Housing Unit Characteristics

In 2009-2013, Kalama, Washington had 1,000 occupied housing units - 655 (64 percent) owner occupied and 372 (36 percent) renter occupied. An estimated 75 percent of householders of these units had moved in since 2000. An estimated 68 percent of the owner occupied units had a mortgage. An estimated less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service. An estimated 3 percent had no vehicles available and another 18 percent had three or more.

House heating fuel used in Kalama, Washington in 2009-2013



► Housing Costs

The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,549, nonmortgaged owners \$453, and renters \$941. An estimated 33 percent of owners with mortgages, 17 percent of owners without mortgages, and 57 percent of renters in Kalama, Washington spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.

Explanation of Symbols:

An '-' entry in the estimate column indicates that either no sample observations or too few sample observations were available to compute an estimate, or a ratio of medians cannot be calculated because one or both of the median estimates falls in the lowest interval or upper interval of an open-ended distribution.

An '-' following a median estimate means the median falls in the lowest interval of an open-ended distribution. An '+' following a median estimate means the median falls in the upper interval of an open-ended distribution.
